*Yahweh* (the Heavenly Father’s Covenant-keeping Name) had claimed Israel as “His son,” when they answered His Call. Through Moses (Exodus 4:22-23) the Almighty brought the multitude out of Egypt by faith. Actually, Israel’s adoption was more about *Yahweh’s* knowledge of what He could do in fallen mankind than about their ability to trust in Him. The entire Plan of Salvation, depicted in the rehearsal journey from Egypt to Canaan, is about tearing down the strongholds of self-sufficiency, to erect a living temple of Praise (Romans 12:1).

Volume one explained the experiences of the calling out of Egypt. Volume two will explore the campsites named for the events that brought the people of *YAH* (title for the Almighty) face-to-Face with humiliation because of their pride, receiving the adoption of sons.

*For whom [Yahweh] loveth He chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom He receiveth. If ye endure chastening, [YAH] dealeth with you as with sons. But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons, Hebrews 12:6-8.*

We may expect to soon face the same challenges, lessons, and tests which the Children of Israel faced in their Wilderness Journey. Many are experiencing these challenges now. Understanding these lessons and tests will prepare us to trust *Yahweh*, whereas former Israel failed. We will notice that their obedience was subject to their surrendering to *Yahweh’s* Will. Never would the Children of Israel perfectly obey His instructions to them. They were as carnal as the men and women today, but *Yahweh* counted their efforts as “acceptable” when they surrendered in brokenness and humiliation. Watch for these lessons throughout this volume. From this examination of the shadow pictures, we may then apply the gained insights to our own lives. Between the pages of this volume, we will examine the camp-lessons (*tikkun* in Hebrew) which taught and tested ancient Israel from the middle fourteen campsites.

These lessons, hidden in names, numbers, and experiences, are for our learning, upon whom the End of the World will come.

*Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come,*

*1 Corinthians 10:11.*

*For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope,*

*Romans 15:4.*

May we have ears to hear and a will to follow through the intensity of these lessons. Victoriously facing these tests in full surrender is essential for the final sealing before we may entering the ultimate Canaan. What *Yahweh* requires, He enables His Children to complete in His strength. **It is our part to surrender our will, it is His part to give us the victory.**
