Worksheet 7: "Introducing the BRANCH Prophecies: Proving Messiahship"

Date: November 17, 2021 @ 9 AM (PDT)

The Five BRANCH PROPHECIES:

As we enter the time, which Scripture calls "The Falling Away", more and more believers are being drawn in to the deceptive lies of the Anti-Messiah. How can we be safe from turning away and being deceived into worshiping another, in a time when the deception, will be overmastering enough to (if possible) even deceive the very elect (Matthew 24:24), what hope have any of us against it?

The lies of the beast - the Anti-messiah of the Last Days - will be undermining Yahshua's Messiahship, getting many well-meaning folks to look for another, or expect "Yahshua" to come back to finish the job. But the answer to these deceptions is found in the Old Testament Branch prophecies. These Branch Prophecies were the Messianic prophecies, which the true Messiah must - and did fulfill. Why is understanding the Branch prophecies - and Yahshua's fulfillment of them - so vitally important a protection against the Anti-messiah in the Last Days? The Lies of the Beast all comes from misconstruing and misunderstanding the Branch prophecies, which authenticate Messiah. For example:

Many today believe in bringing back the animal sacrifices. Why? They don't understand Yahshua's fulfillment of the Branch prophecies, which foretold what Messiah would do as our complete sacrifice.

Many today believe that the third Temple will be Yahweh's temple on earth. Why? They don't understand Yahshua's fulfillment of the Branch prophecies, which foretold that Messiah would build the Temple.

In fact, every Anti-messiah deception comes from distorting or misapplying the Branch prophecies. In order to be protected from the growing deception which will cause many faithful to fall away and accept Anti-messiah, we need to be thorough in our studies of the five Branch prophecies - and Yahshua's fulfillment of them.

Another word for Messiah is Christ. And in the very end, one false messiah will rule the whole world, who will be the final antichrist.

The antichrist is the deceiver – the false messiah who pretends to be Messiah – 1 John 2:18:

“Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time.”

The final moments of earth’s history are characterized by a war of the messiah’s. The true Messiah is Yahshua, Who is coming in the clouds to take the saved people to glory. The false messiah will cause his followers to receive the mark of the beast and ultimate eternal damnation.

Which messiah we follow will determine our eternal destiny. Clearly then, it is vitally important that we are following Yahshua, the true Messiah and do not fall a prey to the deceptions of the false. So how can we be sure that we are following the true Messiah?

To rightly discern the false, we must first fully discern the true. What are the Scriptural identifiers of the true Messiah? They are given in Scripture under five “BRANCH” prophecies. Identifying them with their prophetic elements—and discerning how Yahshua fulfilled each of them—is a powerful protection against falling for the Anti-Christ, who is actually the false Messiah, because the Branch prophecies give us the five-fold ministry of the true Messiah.

The four Gospel writers were working to present the five-ministry roles of the Messiah, which establish Yahshua’s validity as the Messiah. The five roles are:

THE KING
THE SERVANT
THE SON OF MAN
THE SON OF YAH
THE ALMIGHTY JUDGE

The purpose of the Gospel writers was not to provide us with a chronological record of events in the Life of Messiah. Each Gospel writer was telling the story of

Messiah from his individually inspired perspective, portraying Christ's fulfillment of each of these five roles.

Ezekiel and John the Revelator were given visions in which they saw the Throne of Yahweh. In those visions, a special order of angels were seen – called the Seraphim – who serve the Father at His Throne. The holy beings bear shapes which symbolize four of the five roles of the Messiah – which are representing four of the Branch prophecies.



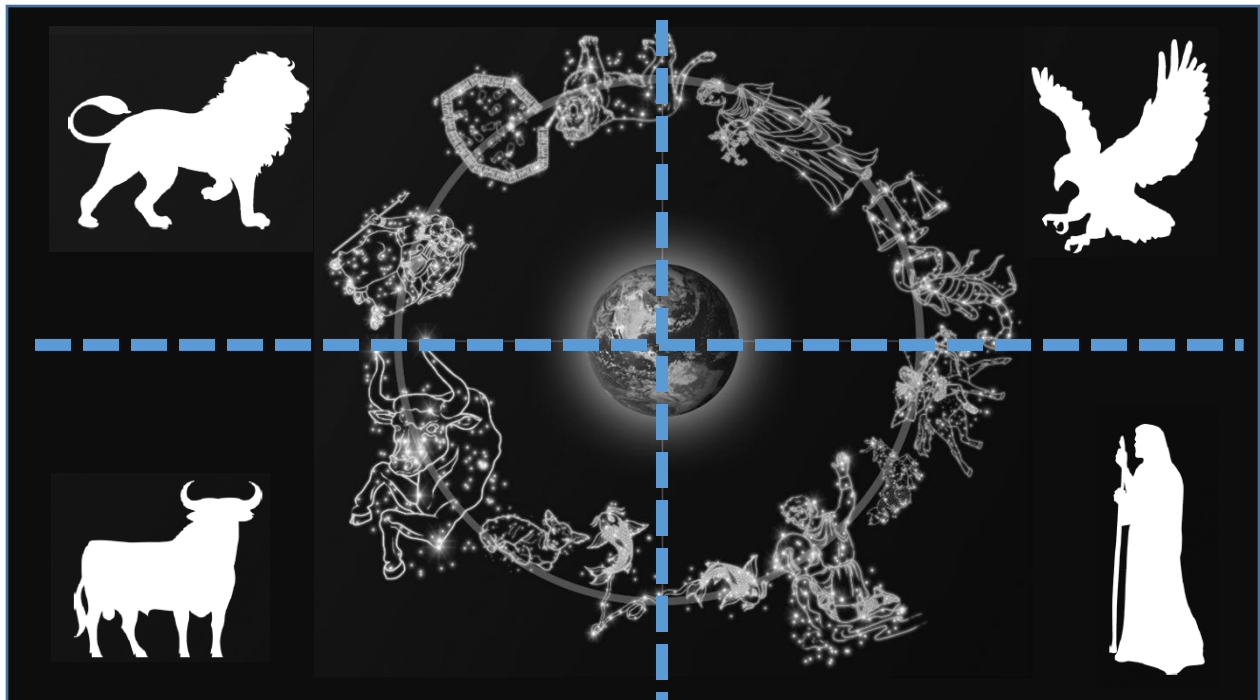
- One looks like a Man– showing Messiah's role as a Man.
- Another looks like an eagle – showing Messiah's divine role and work in Judgment.
- A third looks like a bull – showing Messiah's divine role as the obedient servant who plows the ground for the Heavenly Seed,
- And the fourth looks like a lion – showing Messiah's kingship.

These are four of the five Branch prophecies.

And the fifth Branch prophecy is also seen at the Throne of God. John described the worthy Lamb that was slain. This symbolizes the fifth Branch prophecy which is Yahshua as our substitutionary Sacrifice.

Five times in the writings of the Bible prophets the Messiah is called the Tsemach. The King James translators rendered the word Tsemach into English as BRANCH – which is often in all capital letters. They recognized the Messianic reference in each case where the prophets of Israel used the word Tsemach.

These same Branch prophecies are symbolized in the heavens, where the Creator portrays the plan of redemption in the Mazzaroth.



Why are the Branch prophecies so important? The true Messiah is authenticated by fulfilling each of these five Branch prophecies.

And because these five Branch prophecies identify and prove Messiahship – since only the true Messiah fulfills these Branch prophecies and completes these Messianic roles – the Branch prophecies are the central theme depicted at the Throne of God, they are the central theme of the Mazzaroth, and they are central in the Scriptures as well.

Let's look at the five Branch prophecies, as they appear in the Old Testament prophets.

The first of the five is in Jeremiah. Jeremiah prophesied that the Messiah – the BRANCH - would be a King out of the lineage of David:

1) Jeremiah 33:15 –

- Role of Messiah: Divine Judgment
- Work of Messiah: execute judgment and righteousness in the land
- Gospel with this Focus: Revelation
- Mazzaroth Quadrant: Eagle

2) Zechariah 6:12 –

- Role of Messiah: Messiah as the Man – Example of godly Manhood
- Work of Messiah: He will build the Temple of Yahweh
- Gospel with this Focus: Luke
- Mazzaroth Quadrant: Man

3) Zechariah 3:8

- Role of Messiah: Strong Servant – Burden Bearer
- Work of Messiah: High Priest
- Gospel with this Focus: Mark
- Mazzaroth Quadrant: Bull (Re'eym)

4) Jeremiah 23:5

- Role of Messiah: King of kings
- Work of Messiah: He will reign – being of the lineage of David
- Gospel with this Focus: Matthew
- Mazzaroth Quadrant: Lion

5) Isaiah 4:2-4

- Role of Messiah: He's the One Who is beautiful and glorious (“Beautiful are the feet of them who bring good news” – the Gospel)
- Work of Messiah: Purge Zion in His Blood
- Gospel with this Focus: John
- Mazzaroth: Lamb constellation (Taleh) -
 - Revelation 5:12 “the worthy Lamb that is slain” is Yahshua, referring to His Death on the Cross – it the shape of the Hebrew Tav (the last letter) – the meaning of which is: “It is finished” and it also is “the sign of the Covenant”.

The true Messiah is authenticated by fulfilling each of these five Branch prophecies. For this reason, it should not come as a surprise that the fundamental way the Anti-Christ will be globally accepted is by attacking Yahshua's fulfillment

of the Branch prophecies. If we can be convinced that Yahshua did not fulfill all of the Branch prophecies, we can be caused to look for another – and that other will be the Anti-Christ.

- 2 John 1:6-9 – Yahshua is Christ (Messiah) and has come in the flesh. Whoever denies this is of the spirit of Anti-christ. And only those who have the doctrine (truth) of Yahshua’s Messiahship have Yahweh.

In the Last Days, there is a battle between the Messiahs. Both sides will appear to be **righteous** (Matthew 24:24). So, how can you tell them apart? The only way is

- **The Sign of Jonah** – Messiah said this was a “sign” of His Messiahship (three days and three nights in the tomb – Wednesday vs Friday Crucifixion).
- **The Daniel 70 Weeks Prophecy** – Daniel 9:24-27 tell the timing of the arrival and work of Messiah
- **The Branch Prophecies** – The True Messiah must fulfill the five Branch prophecies in the O.T... The New Testament Gospel writings were giving eye-witness testimony of Yahshua’s fulfillment of the Branch prophecies.

. The true Messiah is the one and only Righteous BRANCH.

- 1 John 2:21-23 – The spirit of Anti-christ denies that Yahshua is Messiah.
- 1 John 4:2-4 - Every spirit that confesseth that Yahshua Christ is come in the flesh is of God. Yahshua is God manifested in the flesh for our Salvation – He is the One and only Messiah.

One of the Roles of the Righteous Branch involves the Temple. Since the Anti-Christ will be attacking Yahshua’s fulfillments of the Branch prophecies, it should not surprise us that the anti-Christ will reign in the Temple that should have been God’s Temple.

- **2 Thessalonians 2:3-4** – There will be a “falling away” before the great Day of our King’s Return. And the Anti-christ, pretending to be God, will sit (reign from) in what should be God’s Temple.

What is the “Falling Away”? (Look it up in Strong’s) “*defection from truth (properly the state), (“apostasy”)*”

- Those who “fall away” were once in the Truth. But they “apostatize” and turn away from the Truth – and the true Messiah – and follow the false.

This is just one of several ways that the spirit of Anti-Christ will twist the Branch prophecies, causing people to believe that the Anti-Christ is the true Messiah.

And the lies of the Anti-Christ in suggesting that Yahshua didn't fulfill the Branch prophecies will be so successful that the Bible warns there will be a “Falling Away”

- The Falling Away is a “turning away from the Truth” – “apostasy”
 - Those who WERE walking in the Truth will TURN away and REJECT the Truth which they formerly BELIEVED.
- The Falling Away is a prophetic event which relates to the setting up of the ABOMINATION of DESOLATION (The Temple).
 - “...he (the Antichrist) as GOD sitteth in the TEMPLE of God, shewing himself that he is GOD.” 2 Thessalonians 2:4






So many will Fall Away from the true Messiah, siding with the Beast – yet still thinking they are part of spiritual Israel – that prophecy calls this false movement the SYNAGOGUE of SATAN - Revelation 3:9

In the days of this deception, how many will remain faithful to the true Messiah? (Romans 9:27; Isaiah 10:21-22) **“though Israel be as numerous as the sand of the sea, only a remnant will be saved.”**

We need to be able to fully understand the Branch prophecies and know how Yahshua fulfilled them, for the deceptions of the rising Anti-Christ power are increasingly challenging Yahshua's fulfillments of these prophecies. And if Yahshua didn't fulfill the five Branch prophecies, then He cannot be the true Messiah – which of course, we know that He is.

It is in the Branch prophecies that we find Yahshua to be authenticated as Messiah.

THE FIVE-FOLD MINISTRY OF MESSIAH (Branch prophecies)

Each Gospel Writer was demonstrating Yahshua's Authenticity as the true Branch/*Tsemach*. Thus, each Gospel writer took a different role of the Messiah to show Yahshua's fulfillment of all five Branch prophecies: the King, the Servant, the Son of Man, the only begotten Son of Yah, and the Almighty Judge. In these five roles, the five-fold ministry of Messiah is accomplished.

So let's start with the Gospel of Matthew.

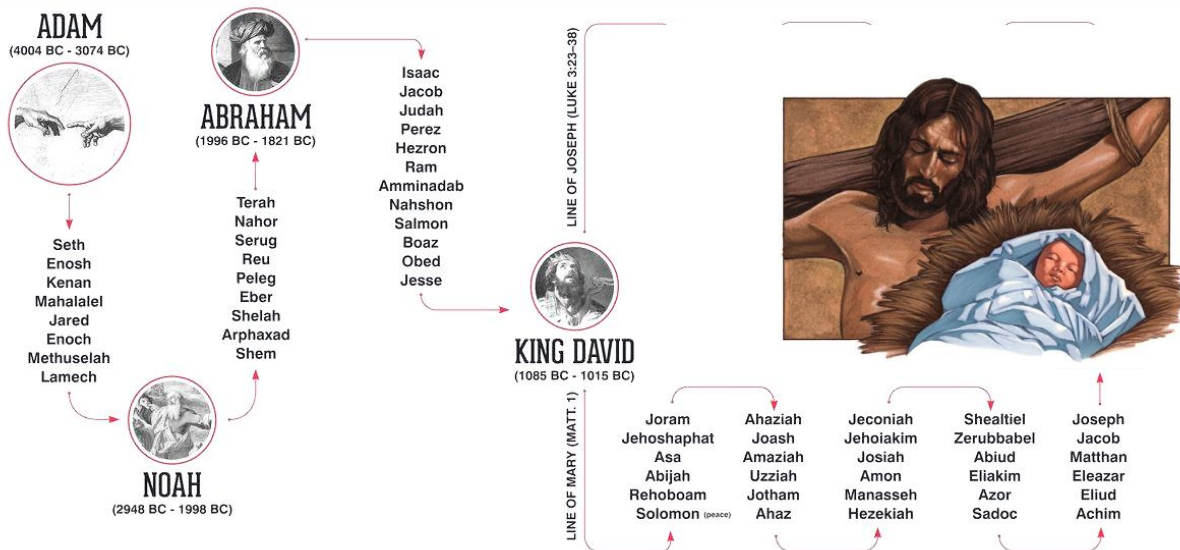
THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW:

The Gospel of Matthew introduces the Messiah as the King from Heaven as He lays down the rules of the Kingdom over which HE will reign forever.

Matthew's record begins by establishing Yahshua's lineage from King David through his only earthly parent – Mary – Miriam, the daughter of Yoseph ben Yaakov – all direct descendants of David through Solomon. The record of the Babylonian astronomers delivering a royal treasure to the young king sets the stage.

NOTE: The alignment point (the first event which the four Gospels all talk about) – is **the FEEDING OF THE 5000**... To find the chronology of Yahshua's Life and Ministry, you have to start from the Feeding of the 5000 and work forward and backward from there.

Genealogy of Messiah



Jeremiah prophesied that the Messiah – the BRANCH - would be a King out of the lineage of David.

Because Matthew’s Gospel was written to show Yahshua’s fulfillment of the Branch prophecy of being King, throughout the book we find references to His Kingdom throughout Matthew. After all, a king must have a Kingdom.

Matthew’s Thread of Kingship:

- Matthew 5:19 – least and great compared in the Kingdom of Heaven.
- Matthew 6:13 – the Master’s prayer “For Thine is the Kingdom...”
- Matthew 9:35 – Yahshua went about teaching the “Gospel of the Kingdom”
- Matthew 12:25 – “...Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation...”
- Matthew 13:33 “The Kingdom of Heaven is like unto leaven...”
- Matthew 16:3 – “Except ye be converted and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the Kingdom of Heaven.”
- Matthew 18:4 – “...humble himself as this little child, the same is greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven.”
- Matthew 19:24 – “...easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter into the Kingdom of God.”
- Matthew 23:13 – “Hypocrites! Ye shut up the Kingdom of Heaven against men...”

- Matthew 27:42 – “If He be the King of Israel, let Him now come down from the cross...”

Matthew doesn't always tell the story in chronological order. He lays down individual incidents as illustrations of Messiah as King laying down the rules of the Kingdom of heaven. It is the rules of the Kingdom that Matthew is interested in – not a chronological record.

The Anti-Christ message is challenging Yahshua's kingship. As we will study thoroughly, people are being told that Yahshua could not be Messiah, or was only a partial one because the true Messiah King will bring peace on earth, which Yahshua did not do.

THE LIE: There is no peace on the earth, therefore Yahshua is not Messiah. When the Messiah comes, He will bring PEACE ON THE EARTH. This is expected in the future “Messiah” who it is believed will reign for a Millennia, bringing peace on the earth – for 1000 years.

The teaching that Yahshua is not Messiah because He didn't bring peace to the earth is a lie. As we will thoroughly study, Yahshua truly is the one and only Branch, who is King of kings.

THE GOSPEL OF MARK

The Gospel of Mark introduces the Messiah as a Servant. Mark doesn't give Messiah's lineage. There's no fanfare. He is just doing the mission that He was sent to accomplish. “*Immediately*”, “*straightway*”, and “*forthwith*” are the words Mark chooses to typify Yahshua's actions. There is no grass growing under His Feet. He has a short time on earth to complete His Mission, or all is lost. The Branch prophecy for Mark is Zechariah 3:8.

Throughout the Gospel of Mark, Yahshua is portrayed as the obedient servant of Yahweh. He is always doing the Will of Yahweh. He is quick to obey, and never does He ever break the Torah, in any way. Here are a few examples throughout the book of Mark, where this Gospel shows Yahshua's Servanthood.

Mark's Thread of Servanthood:

- Mark 1:10 – “And **straightway** coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens opened, and the Spirit like a dove descending upon Him.”
- Mark 1:21 – “They went into Capernaum, and **immediately** on the Sabbath He entered the synagogue and taught.”
- Mark 2:2 – “And **straightway** many were gathered together... And He preached the Word unto them.”
- Mark 5:13 “**forthwith** Yahshua gave them leave. And the unclean spirits went out...”
- Mark 6:25 – “And she came in **straightway** with haste unto the king...”
- Mark 6:54 – “And when they were come out of the ship, **straightway** they knew Him.”
- Mark 9:35 – “And He sat down, and called the twelve, and saith unto them, If any man desire to be first, the same shall be last of all, and servant of all.”
- Mark 14:45 – “And as soon as he was come, he goeth **straightway** to Him and saith, Master...”

The Gospels of Mark and Luke synchronize together to give us a chronology of the Messiah's ministry that we don't see in the other Gospels.

Mark is showing that there is no moss growing under the Saviour's feet – activities bringing Him down the path to His ultimate act of service happen point after point.

Mark doesn't give the Saviour's lineage. This is because a servant's lineage is not relevant. We see Christ through Mark doing the work of a Servant of the Father.

To challenge Yahshua's fulfillment of this Branch role, the spirit of Anti-Christ is now teaching that Yahshua broke the Torah or was counter to it. As such, His role as the obedient servant is lost. But this too is a lie, as we will see in our studies.

Torah contains: (Psalm 19) Commandments (10), Statutes (613), Judgments (blessings or cursings for obedience or disobedience), Testimony (the witness of those who obeyed or disobeyed Yahweh).

- It is suggested that *Yahshua* broke the *Torah* by sparing the woman caught in adultery... But it was a Judgment (which *Yahshua* came to take our death

Judgment upon Himself) that required an adulterous woman to be killed. It was not a Commandment or Statute. So, *Yahshua* did not break it.

- The Jews had blasphemously created another set of rules – the Talmud – The Talmud contained rules added by man’s tradition.
 - Notably, every miracle that *Yahshua* performed broke Talmud – because Talmud’s existence was a breaking of Torah (Deuteronomy states with two witnesses, that no one can “add to” or “diminish ought” from the Torah).
 - Talmud says that you cannot have wine (not even 1 drop) in a water purification pot... *Yahshua* turns the water in the purification at a Pharisee wedding into wine.
 - Talmud says that you have to ceremonially wash hands in a certain way prior to eating... *Yahshua* fed the 5000 men without the washing...
 - Talmud says that you cannot spit in the dirt to make clay... Yet *Yahshua* heals the blind man’s eyes by doing that very thing.

THE GOSPEL OF LUKE

The Gospel of Luke introduces the Messiah as our Example – the Son of Man, who demonstrates how to live by the Rules of the Kingdom.

Luke’s record begins by establish that both Zechariah and Elisabeth were blameless before the Almighty in their compliance with all the commandments in the Torah. *Yahshua*’s supposed lineage (Luke 3:23) through his stepfather Joseph the son of Eli, a direct descendant of David through Nathan, denotes the shadow of illegitimacy under which the Messiah lived. It was supposed that He was the child of Joseph, conceived out of wedlock. Though He appeared to be just a man among men – yet “He shall build the Temple of Yahweh.” The prophecy of *Yahshua* being the Man who builds the Temple of Yahweh is found in Zechariah 6:12.

Luke demonstrates *Yahshua*’s exemplary Manhood. Here are a few cases to demonstrate this theme.

Luke's Thread of Exemplary Manhood

- Luke 1:3 – "...having an accurate understanding of these things, I have undertaken to document these things in chronological order from the very beginning."
- Luke 7:34 – "The **Son of man** is come eating and drinking and ye say, Behold a gluttonous man, and a winebibber, a friend of publicans and sinners!"
- Luke 9:44 – "Let these sayings sink down into your ears: for the **Son of man** shall be delivered into the hands of men."
- Luke 12:10 "And whosoever shall speak a word against the **Son of man**, it shall be forgiven him: but unto him that blasphemeth against the Holy Spirit it shall not be forgiven."
- Luke 17:22 – "...He said unto the disciples, The days will come, when ye shall desire to see one of the days of the **Son of man**, and ye shall not see it."
- Luke 17:30 – "Even thus shall it be in the day when the **Son of man** is revealed."
- Luke 18:31 – "Then He took unto Him the twelve and said unto them, Behold we go up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the **Son of man** shall be accomplished."
- Luke 21:36 – "...Pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the **Son of man**."

Luke shows us why Yahshua could take our place, as the Second Adam – because He was a sinless Man. Luke shows us the obedient life of Christ as our Example - a Man - walking in full obedience to YHWH's Torah. Just as He was obedient and lived life through the power of Heaven as perfect Man – so may we.

The Spirit of Antichrist denies Yahshua's authenticity as the Branch by suggesting that He did not build the Temple – therefore He cannot be the One. But, as we will study more thoroughly, this too is a lie.

The building of the Temple was a spiritual one – He DID build the Temple.

THE GOSPEL OF JOHN

The Gospel of John introduces the Messiah as the incarnation of the Eternal Word, by Whom, and through Whom, and for Whom all things in the physical universe were created.

John introduces Yahshua with the testimony of John the Baptist, who declared to an entourage of Levites and priests that when he baptized Yahshua he saw the messianic sign that had been revealed to Him by the Spirit. John did not herald Him as the Son of God, as he had heard from Heaven, but as the Lamb of God – the sacrifice without blemish - who would atone for the sins of the world.

Isaiah prophesied that the Messiah, the Tsemach, would be the one who would purge the blood and wash away the filth of His people by the blood of the innocent Lamb – Heaven’s sinless Lamb: Isaiah 4:2-4.

John’s Thread of Yahshua as Heaven’s Lamb

- John 1:29 – The next day John saw Yahshua coming unto him, and said, **Behold the Lamb of God**, which takes away the sin of the world.”
- John 1:34 – “And I saw, and bare record that this is the Son of God.”
 - John Defines “Son of God” as a title associated with Redemption (Lamb of God): **John 3:16-17** “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved.”
- John 1:36 – “And looking upon Yahshua as He walked, he saith, **Behold the Lamb of God!**”
- John 3:18 “He that believeth on Him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.”
- John 5:25 – Verily, verily, I say unto you, The hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God...”
- John 9:35 – “...Dost thou believe on the Son of God?”
- John 10:36 – “Say ye of Him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest, because I said, I am the Son of God?”
- John 11:27 – She saith unto Him, Yea, Lord: I believe that Thou art the Messiah, the Son of God, which should come into the world.”

John shows that Christ is the prophesied one Who would be the Son of God and come to die as the sinless Lamb of God.

The Spirit of Antichrist attacks Yahshua's fulfillment of this Branch prophecy by suggesting (in some) that Yahshua is not the Messiah at all... Another Messiah is coming in the future. Or the Spirit of Antichrist sometimes convinces people that Yahshua was Messiah, but He wasn't a strong enough Lamb as His Death did not fulfill all the Sacrifices. In this deception, believers are convinced that Messiah will return to finish His offerings, or the sacrifices need to come back, or another Messiah is coming entirely... These are all lies of the Antichrist, as we will see.

THE GOSPEL OF REVELATION

The Gospel of Revelation begins with seven letters to the seven churches. John then details the events that transpire as Yahshua rips seven seals from the scroll with eternal significance – and specific events play out across the stage of planet Earth at the stripping of each seal.

When the seventh seal is loosed, seven angels blow their trumpets and the seven thunders follow. When the seven thunders are accomplished, the seventh and last trumpet finally sounds and the saints are miraculously saved from the wrath come. After that seven angels pour out the contents of seven bowls full of the smoking Wrath of the Almighty onto the unrepentant inhabitants of the earth. Then Yahshua returns to reign forevermore.

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Revelation 6:10 – “How long O Lord, holy and true, dost Thou not **judge and avenge** our blood on them that dwell on the earth?”

Revelation 19:11 – “The heavens departed and I beheld a white horse! He that sat upon him was called Faithful and True! **He doth judge and make war in absolute righteousness.**”

In Revelation, the final “Gospel,” John shows that Christ is the righteous Judge. This is the fifth and final work of Messiah the BRANCH, as prophesied by the Old Testament prophets – Jeremiah 33:15.

Challenging this final Branch prophecy, the Spirit of Anti-Christ suggests that Yahshua is not Messiah. The “true Messiah” will reign on Earth for 1000 years, allowing sinners a second chance to be saved.

But, as we will study, Yahshua is the Messiah. And when He comes, Judgment is complete.

The definitive characteristic of the Anti-Messiah and its deceptive spirits is the rejection of *Yahshua* in three ways:

- 1) Denying that *Yahshua* is Christ (Messiah) Who was God manifested in the Flesh (1 John 4:2-4).
- 2) Denying that *Yahshua* fulfilled(s) the five BRANCH prophecies.
- 3) Denying the testimony that *Yahshua* is the Manifestation of God in the Flesh – Isaiah 9:6

In the end, final Israel—the saved people of Yahweh who do not worship the Beast or receive his mark—will be those who live by two key identifiers (Revelation 12:17):

- 1) They keep the Commandments of Yahweh**
- 2) They have the Testimony that Yahshua is Messiah**

Having the Testimony of *Yahshua* doesn't only mean that we follow His Example (by His Grace), it also means that we believe *Yahshua* is Messiah—the One foretold in the five Branch prophecies. We must have both beliefs from Revelation 12:17 to be safe from the overmastering lies of the seemingly Torah-keeping Beast!

The Last Days is characterized by a war of the Messiahs. Most of the world – even those who once accepted *Yahshua* as their Messiah – will change sides and serve the Anti-Messiah. One of the main reasons this will happen to former believers is that they will be deceived by the Antichrist's twisting of the Branch prophecies and by its suggestions that *Yahshua* didn't fulfill them (1 John 2:18).

Let us be thorough students of the Branch prophecies, and in *Yahshua*'s fulfilment.

Questions:

- Anti-Messiah's teachings (thoroughly) which come against *Yahshua*'s fulfillment of the Branch prophecies.
- Why these teachings are wrong – and what is the right teaching (using the 5 keys).
- Comparing the Truth with the Counterfeit.
